No Fish Today!

If you have any surplus goldfish at home, and are thinking about putting them in some of the new ponds that have been created near the AGS - DON'T DO IT!

According to Ed Hunter, PE & P, goldfish feed on bottom plants, and are hearty eaters. If they are placed in a new pond, they will prevent greens from growing on the bottom, and will retard the growth of natural vegetation. Studies are now underway by Hunter and the NY Conservation Department to determine the proper fish that should be stocked in the ponds. Temperature and flow measurements are being made with a view to making the ponds a home for the kind of fish that will provide sport as well as an ecological balance.
