Nostalgic Shopping For The Holidays

It's 20 to 30 years too late to buy these items for giving this Christmas, but they are listed just in case they ever become popular again!

First, a real live Christmas tree. This item is still to be found in some shops, but not in its original form. The tree we offer has no plastic or metal, and gets resin all over your hands when you nail the simple wooden stand to its base. It is guaranteed to shed its needles a few days after Christmas.
