Mixed Softball Program To Start

BERA has approved our request to sponsor and provide equipment and a field for our newly organized Mixed Softball Program.

So far, 50 have indicated their interest and have signed up to play. A committee has been at work devising rules and the League structure. Tuesday has been chosen - we hope this will be satisfactory to everyone. Games will be played at the Brookhaven Employees' Recreation Park. The season, which will begin on June 9, will continue for approximately 10 weeks. At the present time it is planned to have two games scheduled for the evening with an hour and fifteen minute time limit so that you will know in advance how long you'll be playing. The first game will start promptly at 5:30 and conclude at 6:45. The second game will begin at 7:00 and conclude at 8:15. Of course, the schedule will be adjusted if necessary to provide for additional play.

A soft, softball will be used and certain rules have been modified to prevent injury (...like no sliding, etc...). The main purpose of the program is to have fun - and other rule changes will be instituted as necessary to serve this purpose.

There is still time to get in on the fun. If you have not already signed up, individuals may do so by calling Georgia Irving, Ext. 2186. Or, you may pick up an application blank at the Recreation Office and form your team. All you need is 6 gals and 6 fellows. The entry fee has been set at \$2.00 per player which will enable you to participate in the BNL Softball Night Program sponsored by the Men's Softball Leagues at the season's close. (Note: members of the Men's Softball League are exempt from the entry fee.)

Those 50 already registered have been assigned to teams and should forward their fees to their assigned temporary captains.

Team members will be sent a copy of their team roster and League rules before the season's start. Shortly afterwards, elections will be held to elect permanent captains and League officials.

We know that you know there will be chip-in type refreshments at all the games.

T.B. Lam To Lecture

Dr. T.B. Lam, Assistant Professor of History at the State University of New York at Stony Brook will give a talk on "The Origins and Nature of the American Intervention in Vietnam" on Thursday, June 4 at 8:30 p.m. in the North Room of the Brookhaven Center.

Dr. Lam will speak about the history of American intervention, and its impact on Vietnamese political development, following which there will be a question period.

Dr. Lam received his Ph.D. in Modern History from Louvain University in Belgium. He is a native of South Vietnam, and has taught at the University of Saigon and the University of Hue in Vietnam. Since 1964 Dr. Lam has been in the United States. His field of special interest, which he teaches at Stony Brook, is the history of South East Asia.

This non-official talk is sponsored by the Vietnam Moratorium Committee and is open to all laboratory employees. Families and personal friends may accompany staff members on this occasion.
