For several months the Research Library has had the capability to search three on-line literature information retrieval systems. The number of files that can be searched totals over 40. Major files of interest to the BNL staff include those in the fields of chemistry, physics, engineering, nuclear science, biology, energy, metallurgy, meteorology and oceanography. During this time, Madeline Windsor of the Research Library staff has familiarized herself with these data bases, has acquired the basics of search strategy, and has learned to operate the terminal.

The Research Library is now prepared to augment its manual searching service with a machine search under the following conditions:

1. Searches will be conducted only after an appointment has been made with Madeline.

2. A consultation with Madeline in the library will be needed before a search is begun.

3. Searches will be made only when authorized by an Inter-Laboratory Requisition as the department requesting the search will be charged for all connect time costs.
