and tide, but this was compensated for by the beauty of the rivers overhung with mangroves, the white sandy beaches and the spotting of a crocodile, dolphins, sea turtles, and small sharks in the water. It is estimated that the four who made this trip - Don David (Accel.), Arthur Dawson, John Hattayer (DAS) and Bob Herman - paddled over 100,000 strokes on the six-day trip.

The group that made the trip up to the Gulf and down Lake Ingram - Joanne DeLise (S&EP), Tony Fainberg, Dennis Weygand (Physics) and Barry Lovitt (Physics) - had to paddle against strong winds in shallow water the day they crossed the lake and did not make it to a campsite by dark. So, they had to spend the night sleeping in their canoes tied up to some mangrove trees.

The third group of Dave Potter (Instrumentation), Carol Petraitis (Public Relations), Peter Petraitis, Kathy Tuohy (Medical), Cleve Dodge (DAS) and Bill Lamoureux, spotted over 130 species of birds on their trip. One very special sighting was of a nesting pair of bald eagles in a small mangrove island. A three-day trip took them through the Homestead Canal, arched with black and red mangroves and marked by different exotic birds at each curve. The birding group met up with Don David and Arthur Dawson in the Cape Sable area where they all camped on a small virgin beach barely visible from the sea. The campfire that night was more exciting than expected - a scorpion crawled out from one of the burning logs.

Every day was hot and sunny with temperatures in the 80's. Most of the campsites had few mosquitos but many racoons. On the way home Saturday, one van stopped off at Disney World for swimming and sightseeing and the other van stopped at a couple of parks for more birding. They hope to make the trip again next year.



PRESERVING THE PAST - In 1798 Elizabeth C. Smith died on Long Island at the age of five. Her tombstone and another dated 1752 were found by the Huntington Historical Society and brought to Brookhaven to be treated by modern technology for preservation. The stones were impregnated with polymer and the surfaces rebonded at the Process Technology Division of DAS where this process was created. Besides its present-day applications, concrete polymer technology is proving invaluable in preserving the stone artifacts and sculptures of the past.
