"The Politics of Black Stereotyping in American Popular Culture" will be the subject of a lecture and slide show to be presented by Marguerite Ross Barnett on Wednesday, November 17 at 8 p.m. in Berkner Hall. Dr. Barnett, a professor of political science at Columbia University, has been collecting examples of popular art that reflect black stereotyping. Her collection covers the period from the Civil War to the 1940's, and includes household utensils, toys, drawings and other memorabilia depicting blacks. In previous talks on this subject, Dr. Barnett has used these items to support her view that such stereotyping was an attempt on the part of the political culture to deny blacks equal status and rights. The lecture is sponsored by the Afro-American Culture Club and everyone is invited to attend.


