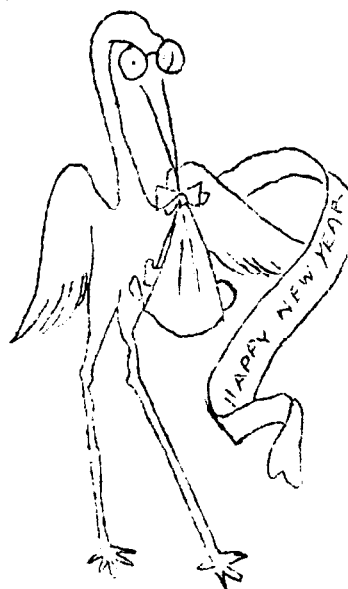

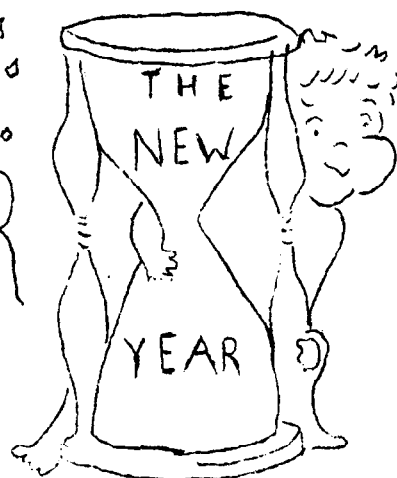

BERA PLANS HOUSE FOR SABINES

Laboratory staff members were shocked at the news of the fire that completely destroyed the home of George F. Sabine, Laboratory patrolman, and caused the death of his 6-year old daughter. Almost all of the possessions of George and his family were lost in the fire.

Fraternal orders, churches and various other groups in Patchogue, Holtsville and Farmingville are gathering funds to assist the Sabine's, and Laboratory staff members have contributed to a special fund for this purpose.

Budd S. Pollack, president of BERA, is working on a plan to build a new house for George and his family, and staff members have already pledged more than 2000 hours of labor.
