WORK STARTED ON SABINE HOUSE FRAME

Fresent plans are to nail on sheating, erect frame for the garage and install the window frames next weekend, January 29 and 30. "This work does not require skilled labor", stated George Wagner, who is directing the construction, "we can use ten to twenty workmen and all they need bring with them is a hammer or a saw."

"The speed with which the house is completed depends, of course, on the number of workers that report", Wagner continued, "No one need worry about lack of experience. There are plenty of tasks that can be done by the unskilled workers."
