WORK STARTED ON SABINE HOUSE FRAME

The Sabine house is beginning to take shape. The frame for the side walls was erected on Saturday, January 22, by a crew of staff members consisting of George Wagner, Harold Euler, John Lorenc, John Maiello, Harry Duffield and Peter Prentky. William Phillips and John Staudt painted window frames. On Sunday, January 23, the roof trusses were assembled and set in place by staff members George Wagner, Harold Euler, Budd Pollock, John Handloser, John Michel, Henry Brewer, Theodore Korsos and Charles Boulton.

Present plans are to nail on sheathing, erect frame for the garage and install the window frames next weekend, January 29 and 30. "This work does not require skilled labor", stated George Wagner, who is directing the construction, "we can use ten to twenty workmen and all they need bring with them is a hammer or a saw."

"The speed with which the house is completed depends, of course, on the number of workers that report", Wagner continued, "No one need worry about lack of experience. There are plenty of tasks that can be done by the unskilled workers."
