HAVE YOUR DOGS TRAINED-- 4-LEGGED ONES

Mr. Milo Fearsall, recognized as one of the country's leading obedience trainers, has agreed to teach BERA members and their dogs obedience training. Mr. Fearsall is a man of considerable experience in the obedience ring and is a recognized judge at American Kennel Club trials. At the present time he is beginning his third year as director of the Suffolk Obedience Training Club--a club which finished 14 companion dogs, 1 companion dog excellent and 2 obedience trained bench champions during this past year alone. He is now directing obedience classes at both Huntington Station and Amityville. Indicative of both the interest and of Mr. Fearsall's ability, the classes have been meeting every single week for over one and two years respectively. In each of his classes, Mr. Fearsall is assisted by a trained staff of handlers and feels that every dog, regardless of his breed or personality, will respond to proper training.

It is urged that all dog owners, who wish to experience the companionship that obedience training develops between a dog and his handler, fill out the questionnaire included with this edition. Both parties will benefit, and who knows, maybe you
