The Brookhaven Concert Group is proud to present Miss Sondra Bianca in a piano recital on Monday evening, May 22, 1950. Her program will include works of Beethoven, Chopin, Bach, Mozart, etc. The program will be printed next week. Tickets are on sale now for \$1.50 (including tax).

Miss Bianca recently had a most successful N.Y. recital debut in Carnegie Hall with wide acclaim from the newspaper critics.

Following are a few notes on Miss Bianca:

Born in New York City on November 17, 1930, Sondra Bianca began to study piano before she was four years old, with her mother, a former concert pianist, who gave up her own career in order to foster her daughter's talent.

At the age of four, Sondra won a scholarship at the Mannes Music School studying with Frank Sheridan, then one at the Curtis Institute to study with Isabella Vengerova; later she worked with Ernest Hutcheson and Angela Weschler.

Sondra Bianca appeared in her first public concert at the age of 5. Walter Damrosch in introducing her on a radio broadcast, called her "the most gifted child pianist since the prodigy Josef Hofmann." - and Bruno Walter called her "a big pianist packed in a little

Although her appearances have been restricted so that art might mature normally, Sondra Bianca has performed intermittently both as recitalist and as soloist with orchestras including the New York Philharmonic Symphony, the NBC Symphony, the Philadelphia Orchestra, the Montreal Philharmonic and many others.

The youngest student ever to enter New York's Hunter College, Sondra Bianca graduated from there last year with high honors, one of few, if any, career concert pianists to obtain a BA degree from an American College.

Now, at 19, she has just finished a 16 mm. educational music film, she has her own radio program which is recorded here and broadcast in Paris on one of the Networks of Radio Diffusion Francaise, and she is recording a series of lecture recitals for schools and colleges on Long Playing records for the Sound Book Press Society.
