NO SWEET CORN

Dr. Singleton of the Biology Dept. has asked the Bulletin Board to print the following statement for the information of all employees:

"There will be no sweet corn for distribution to members of the Laboratory Staff this summer. All of the corn that will be grown on the site is for experimental purposes. This is a warning that people who want sweet corn had better plant their own. There is still ample time to plant corn if it ever stops raining.

"There are several reasons why corn will not be available. Getting corn ready for staff members entails considerable work. No one will be available to do this work. Another reason is that last year several ears of experimental corn were taken without permission from plots growing on the site. We want all to know that all corn on the site is for experimental purposes and none should be taken by anyone. Furthermore, all experimental corn will be treated with a deer repellant which will render it unpalatable and possibly poisonous."
