# ILLINOIS TROFESSOR TO ASSIST DIRECTOR OF BNL

Dr. Gerald F. Tape, formerly associate professor of physics of the University of Illinois, has joined the scientific staff of the Laboratory to assist Dr. Haworth, director, with the overall scientific administration of the Laboratory.

Dr. Tape went to the University of Illinois in 1946. His schedule was divided between research and design work on the University's cyclotron and associated problems and the administration of engineering physics courses for several hundred students. At Cornell University, 1939 to 1942, he taught physics courses and did cloud chamber research in connection with the University's cyclotron. From 1935 to 1939 he did graduate work and taught at the University of Michigan, where he obtained his ... h.D. after special studies in the field of nuclear physics. From 1942 to 1946 Dr.
