WHAT IS BERA?

The question has been asked often and quite likely the answer you have received is inaccurateor incomplete. It is hoped that the following article will answer most of your questions.

BERA is . . .

An association formed by the employees which promotes athletic competition, cultural and social activities and the use of available recreational facilities on the site. All employees are members.

BERA is made up . . .

Primarily of organized groups of twenty-five or more employees participating in recreational activities approved by the Laboratory. Second

BERA is administered by

A Board of Trustees composed of a member from each organized activity and a representative of the Laboratory who has no vote. Under this arrangement we have a Board member who is actively engaged in some BERA activity and because of his association with other Board members is very much aware of the plans and problems of all other groups. The Board's biggest jobs are to formulate the policies, rules and regulations of the Association and to authorize a budget. Believe it or not these few words actually mean a lot of work. Specifically, let's look at the case of the multiplying horseshoes. There are more horseshoes on the site than there are horses in Suffolk and if they were laid one atop the other around a stake they'd represent a tidy sum of money. The experts tell us one set lasts only one season. Now the question before the Board was, "Does BERA pay for all horseshoes now and forever more?" The decision was this -- if a supervisor requests a set from the Recreation Office a set will be provided but replacements will be supplied by the group using the set.

Early last March, a Board member first proposed an "Activities Night." The single purpose of the program was to show you, the members of BERA, what the activities were and what they were doing. A lot of hard work and fun ended up with the evening such a success that every effort will be made to have the next "Activities Night" better still.

Finally the Board is also the Recreation complaint dept. If you have any criticism concerning the way the recreation program is handled, don't gripe about it to your friends, your riders, or your grandmother, make your gripes known to a Board member; he is the only one who can give you an explanation and the Board is the only group that can discuss your problem and rectify it.

BERA gets its money from . . .

Concessions, certain of the activities and the Laboratory. As a percentage of the profits from the gas station, rental library, candy, cigarette, coke and nut machines accrues to the BERA treasury, every stop at the gas station and your dimes and nickels clinking into the vending machines helps the financing of all activities. From candy sales and book sales BERA gets an additional small profit.

The income from plays, concerts, movies and dances also goes into the treasury. Your support of these activities helps to finance the over-all program. All cash goes into a general fund and no activity has a treasury of its own.

BERA spends its money for . . .

Band instruments, camera equipment, concert artists, softball gloves, theatricals costumes and make-up, model railway equipment and even the little things like PAGE 2
