WHAT IS BERA?

It was just about a year ago that we answered this question in the Bulletin Board. We certainly hope that the article then cleared some of the doubts as to just what BERA is and how BERA operates.

But new employees have arrived and older employees might again like the story of BERA.

(1) BERA is . . .

An association formed by the employees which promotes athletic competition, cultural and social activities on the site. All employees are members.

(2) BERA is made up . . .

Primarily of organized groups of twenty-five or more employees participating in recreational and cultural activities approved by the Laboratory. At this date, the following cultural activities are participating in the BERA program.

Theatre Group	The Camera Club
Film Study Group	The Model Railroad Group
The Band	The Choral Group
The Concert Group	The Square Dance Group

In addition, the Physical Activities Groups include softball, tennis, golf, bowling, table tennis, badminton, basketball, horseshoes, and rifle-pistol club.

### (3) BERA is administered by . . .

A Board of Trustees composed of a member from each organized activity and a representative of the Laboratory who has no vote. Under this arrangement we have a Board member who is actively engaged in some BERA activity and because of his association with other Board members is very much aware of the plans and problems of all other groups. The Board's biggest jobs are to formulate the policies, rules and regulations of the Association and to authorize a budget. The Board keeps constantly aware of current progress of all activities and does its utmost to see that the funds are spent wisely.

Finally the Board is also the Recreation complaint department. If you have any criticism concerning the way the recreation program is handled, don't gripe about it to your friends, your riders, or your grandmother, make your gripes known to a Board member; he is the only one who can give you an explanation and the Board is the only group that can discuss your problem and rectify it.

# (4) BERA gets money from . . .

Concessions, certain of the activities and the Laboratory. As a percentage of the profits from the gas station, rental library, candy, cigarette, coke and nutmachines accrues to the BERA treasury, every stop at the gas station and your dimes and nickels clinking into the vending machines helps the financing of all activities. From candy sales and book sales BERA gets an additional small profit.

The income from plays, concerts, movies and dances also goes into the treasury. Your support of these activities helps to finance the over-all program. All cash goes into a general fund.

(5) BERA spends its money for ....

Band instruments, camera equipment, concert artists, softball gloves, theatrical costumes and make-up, model railway equipment and even the little things like ping pong balls and piano tuning.
