- 3. Tuesday, January 6, 1953: Juilliard String Quartet. The Juilliard Quartet, one of the outstanding ensembles now playing, needs no introduction to the BNL audience, having been enthusiastically received here in 1950 and 1951.
- 4. (Date to be announced): Alexander Schneider, violin. Mr. Schneider is well known for his varied activities in chamber music and for his many recordings. He was instrumental inarranging the Casals festivals in France in the past few summers.
- 5. Wednesday, March 25, 1953: Joel Rosen, pianist. Mr. Rosen will be remembered for his appearance here last spring with the Kell Chamber players.
