Alexander Schneider and Mieczyslaw Horszowski are among the best known names in chamber music today. Schneider, for many years, was a member of the famous Budapest String Quartet, later founded the Albeneri Trio, and has also been widely acclaimed for his superb renditions of the Bach sonatas and partitas for solo violin and for his sonata recitals and recordings with Ralph Kirkpatrick, harpsichordist, and Eugene Istomin, pianist. Last year Mr. Schneider, with a newly formed string quartet, performed and recorded all of Haydn's quartets. Here is just one of the innumerable enthusiastic press notices Mr. Schneider has received (this one for his rendition of the Bach works for solo violin): "Musical critics were put clean out of business by the violin playing of Alexander Schneider last night. Execution and intonation were of such an impeccable sort as gave no chance for discussion outside of approval and praise" (from the Christian Science Monitor, Nov. 24, 1948).

Mr. Horszowski is no stranger to the Brookhaven audience; he gave a solo recital here in October 1951. But Mr. Horszowski has also acquired an outstanding reputation as an ensemble player. He has given numerous sonata recitals and made many excellent recordings with Casals, Szigeti and Kell. For several years now, Horszowski and Schneider have performed and recorded together as members of the New York Quartet (Milton Katims and Frank Miller are its other members), and this group has received wide acclaim. One reviewer wrote of Mr. Horszowski's part in the quartet: "He is one of the world's wizards in the chamber music field." The joint recital by Horszowski and Schneider promises to be an outstanding musical event. BNL music lovers shouldn't miss it!
