FILM FUN ON MONDAY, FEB. 7

The last Guinness of the current film series will be the feature at the "flicks", Monday, Feb. 7 in the Lecture Hall at 8:20 p.m. "Kind Hearts and Coronets" is the hilariously tragic story of the tenth Duke of Chalfont and the eight people who had to be done away with before the title was his. A career of homicide ends in the House of Lords.

It is anticipated that a 10 minute short entitled "Suite of Berber Dances" will be included in the evenings entertainment. The distributor of this film is not particularly reliable and it will be an agreeable surprise if the print arrives. The film is a study of three folk dances of the isolated Berbers of Morocco. Presented initially is a sophisticated dance by a group of men who provide their own music with stringed instruments and drums. It is a dance with which a Berber host entertains his guests. Outside the city in the foot hills of the Atlas Mountains, a rural dance by the Tasqueens is performed. This is a war dance with warriors
