Fourth Concert of B.E.R.A. Series THE MOYSE TRIO

Thursday, March 10, 1955 - 8:30 P.M. - Research Staff Lounge

The Moyse Trio was created in 1933 by Marcel Moyse, head of the famous French Woodwind Instruments School. He is known all over the world for his instruction, for his compositions for the flute, and for his flute recordings. For 20 years he was a professor at the Paris National Music Conservatory, and he was solo flautist with many European symphony and opera orchestras.

Blanche Honegger, wife of Louis Moyse, was a pupil of Adolph Busch and played as concert soloist with the Paris symphony as well as orchestras in Berlin, Oslo, Stockholm, Copenhagen, Basle and Geneva.

Louis Moyse, who plays the flute as well as the piano, was connected with the Lamoureaux orchestra for several years, and instructed at the Paris Conservatory.

The Moyse Trio has given concerts all over Europe and South America and has made many outstanding recordings, winning the International Records Prize in 1938, with its Bach Trio in G. Critics consider the trio one of the most perfect chamber music ensembles. The famous biographer Emil Ludwig, after having heard a concert given by the Moyse Trio in Lucerne, Switzerland, described it as "unforgettable" and said "It is certainly very rare to hear the flute and the piano, the flute and the violin, and the three together, but it is still rarer to hear them played with such perfection and such musical culture in this day and age."

FILM STUDY GROUP TO SHOW "SEXTETTE" On Monday evening, March 7th, the film group will present a French anthology of short film stories in which the old inn-keeper recounts the most interesting tales of his lifetime of running a resort hotel in the French Alps. The six stories portrayed are: "The Gun", a love triangle ending with a suicide; "Female Affair," a young woman on the prowl for a rich mate; "The Key to Sin" a story of unrequited love; "Snow Queen", a beautiful woman with a psychological affliction; "Seducer's Fate", another love triangle ending in violence; and "Ski Champ", a comic tale of how ski

champs are made and girl's hand is won.

A documentary short entitled "Pertaining to Marin" will also be shown.

The film contains glimpses of the artist's unguarded moments with friends and relatives as well as camera studies of his important oils and water colors.
