Fifth Concert of B.E.R.A. Series

Leonid Hambro, Pianist, and Members of the WQXR String Quartet

Tuesday, April 5, 1955 - 8:30 P.M. - Research Staff Lounge (Note change from previously scheduled dates)

Leonid Hambro has often been referred to as the busiest pianist in the music world. In his capacity as staff pianist for station WQXR he is called upon to perform the piano solo and chamber music repertory to the extent of programs totaling more than 20 full length concerts a year. In his role as official pianist for the New York Philharmonic Orchestra, Mr. Hambro has played under the direction of some of the world's greatest conductors. He also finds time to perform in outside concert series, to make recordings, and to do work for the theater, television, and films.

Mr. Hambro gave his first public performance at the age of 5. A succession of awards, fellowships, and periods of study with renowned musicians followed. In the winter of 1952 Mr. Hambro made musical history at a Town Hall concert by performing a difficult Hindemith concerto, the music to which he had never seen until the night before the concert. Mr. Hindemith afterwards informed the audience, "you have just witnessed a kind of miracle".

The WOXR String Quartet is one of the few musical groups specifically organized by a radio station for its exclusive use. In their six years of performing a weekly program on WQXR they have come to be recognized as one of the leading string quartets in New York City.

Three of the members of the WQXR String Quartet, Harry Glickman, violin, Jack Braunstein, viola, and Harvey Shapiro, cello, together with Mr. Hambro will perform the following works at their BNL concert on Tuesday, April 5.

Quartet Op. 60 ----- Brahms
INTERMISSION
Quartet Op. 15 ----- Faure
