Set construction has been handled by Don Fluke, Sven Hasselriis (Phys), Lynn Paege and Lou Gidez, lights by Janet Geisselsoder (Bio) and Herbert Geisselsoder, props by Harold and Ruth Schwarz, make-up by Cynthia Corngold, costumes by Sybil Sugarman and Chris Bothner-By, With Mary Kinsley (Hot Lab) as wardrobe mistress, publicity by Chris Bothner-By, Marge Dreyfus, John Antal (Phys) Bernice Antal (Med) and Mary Jane Sears, ticket sales by Sylvia Springhorn and Arthur Kowalsky, both from Biology, house by John Antal, Bernice Antal and Lucy Duke (Med) and the program by George Cox (Photo) and Mary Jane Sears.
