Narrated by Alexander Scourby.

LIFE IN THE ARTIC - Photographed in color in the U.S.S.R., this film depicts life on land, under the ice, and in the air through the Artic seasons. On land, bears, seals and foxes; under the ice, weird and beautiful variety of marine creatures, and in the air, the combined forces of a colony of seabirds ward off an attacking eagle.
