WUMMER-VALENTI DUO

The BERA Concert Group will present John Wummer, flutist, and Fernando Valenti, harpsichordist, in the first concert of the season. It will be held next Wed., Oct. 10, at 8:30 p.m. in the Research Staff Lounge. Those who have not already bought tickets may obtain them at the door.

Mr. Valenti studied with Ralph Kirkpatrick, and shares his interest in the sonatas of Scarlatti, which are being recorded in their entirety by Mr. Valenti. He has appeared at the Tanglewood Festival, and at the 1950 Prades Festival directed by Pablo Casals. In 1951, he became the first harpsichordist on the faculty of the Juilliard School of Music.

Mr. Wummer was the solo flutist in the NBC Symphony Orchestra from its creation in 1937 until 1942. Since then he has been solo flutist with the N.Y. Philharmonic Symphony. He has also been active in the chamber music field, and participated in the 1950 Prades Festival, and the 1951 Perpignan Festival, both under the direction of Pablo Casals.

The program will consist of: Sonata in G major-Handel (flute and harpsichord); Four Sonatas-Scarlatti (harpsichord); Sonata in E major-Bach (flute and harpsichord); Sonata in A minor for Solo Flute-Bach; and Sonata in D major-Quantz (flute and harpsichord).

BLINDFOLD CHESS DEMONSTRATION

About a year ago George Koltanowski, the world's BLINDFOLD CHESS CHAMPION gave a demonstration of his prowess by trouncing 18 of Brookhaven's chess players simultaneously and then beating two of our best players simultaneously while blindfolded. He has offered to come again if there is sufficient interest. He puts on a complete evening's show. It's good entertainment for anyone with any interest at all in chess, and there's much more to it than the games which will be played.

There will be a charge of about \$2.00 per board played - possibly less if enough players turn out. REGISTRATION

The Local Board of Elections at 246 Griffing Avenue, Riverhead (Park 7-2508) has given the following information as to the voting requirements of persons occupying accommodations here at the Laboratory: a) Residence in New York State for one year. b) Residence in Suffolk County for four months. c) Residence in the voting district for thirty days.

Any persons meeting these requirements should register and vote in Election Dist. No. 10 of the Town of Brookhaven. This is located at Yaphank in the Yaphank Fire House on Main St. The dates of registering and voting are as follows:

Registration: Saturday, October 6th - 7 a.m. to 10 p.m. and Saturday, Oct. 13th - 1 p.m. to 10 p.m. Voting: Tuesday, November 6th - 6 a.m. to 9 p.m.

Anyone not meeting the residence requirements here in New York and wishing to vote in the state in which he formerly held residence, should write to the Secretary of State of his home state, or to Board of Elections in place from which he came. The local authorities are different in various states, but our Board of Elections assures us that the Secretary of State would forward any request for absentee ballot to the proper local authorities for action.

If any potential voters are exercising the right to vote for the first time, having arrived at the age of twenty-one since the last national election, they will be required to show a birth certificate. In addition, they must show a diploma from grammar, high school, or college in connection with a literacy qualification. If such a document is not available, a short literacy test is given at the polling place. Affidavits are available at polling place for literacy and citizenship.

Any naturalized citizen must produce naturalization papers, and must have been naturalized 90 days prior to voting.
