## WHAT IS BERA ?

**BERA** (Brookhaven Employees' Recreation Association) is an Association formed by the employees which promotes athletic competition, cultural and social activities on and off the site. All employees are members.

**BERA** is made up .....  
Primarily of organized groups of twenty-five or more employees participating in recreational and cultural activities approved by the Laboratory. At present, the following cultural and social groups are participating in the BERA program: Theatre Group, Film Study Group, Square Dance Group, Concert Group, Cereamics Group, Camera Club, and Telescope Makers.

In addition, the Physical Activities include softball, tennis, bowling, table tennis, badminton, basketball, horseshoes, fencing, and rifle-pistol club.

**BERA** is administered by.....

A board of Trustees composed of a member from each organized activity and a representative of the Laboratory. Under this arrangement we have a Board Member who is actively engaged in some BERA activity and because of his association with other Board Members is very much aware of the plans and problems of all other groups. Any group of twenty-five employees wishing to start an approved recreational activity is entitled to representation. Groups of less than twenty-five may request representation. The Board's biggest jobs are to carry out the policies, rules and regulations of the association as set down in its constitution, and to authorize a budget. The Board keeps constantly aware of current progress of all activities, encourages new activities, and does its utmost to see that all funds are spent wisely.

**BERA** gets its money from.....

Concessions and certain of the activities. A percentage of the profits from the gas station, public telephones, rental library, candy and cigarette machines accrues to the BERA treasury. The Coca-Cola machines, owned by BERA, return a profit. From group buying BERA gets an additional small profit.

The income from plays, concerts, movies, and dances also goes into the treasury. Your support of these activities helps to finance the overall program. All cash goes into a general fund.

**BERA** spends its money for.....

Such things as film rentals, awards, dances, camera equipment, concert artists, soft-ball gloves, theatrical costumes, attendants at the swim-

ming pool, and even the little things like ping-pong balls, horseshoes, and piano tuning.

Finally, **BERA** is an association of the employees. You are a member, If you have any suggestions, criticism, or complaints concerning the way the recreation program is handled, make them known to a Board Member.
