**AUGUST FILM LISTINGS**

**August 5 Cavalcade of American Serials**

A rare and hilarious compilation of hair-raising climaxes from some of the most famous "cliff hangers" of the period, complete with stunts, yawning chasms and Pearl White.

**Dark River**

A first view for the U.S. of the work of Hugo del Carril, a film director influenced by the neo-realist school. **Dark River** has been compared to **Bitter Rice** in subject and treatment and although the Argentinian police censors were opposed to the film which is an expose of conditions on yerba maté plantations in Argentina, the film was allowed to be shown. No Magnano, but plenty yerba maté.

**August 12 Power of Plants**

Unusual scientific film offering a fascinating time-lapse study of plants pushing through layers of tin-foil, lifting weights and breaking bottles. Two botanists lost their lives while making this film.

**Devil in the Flesh**

One of the highlights of French cinema is Claude Autant-Laras' beautifully directed story of the poetic and often bitter love affair between a French adolescent schoolboy and the wife of a soldier in the first World War. With Girard Philipe and Micheline Presle.

**August 19 Uirapuru**

Prizewinner at the 1951 Edinburgh and Venice International Film Festivals, this exotic film poem offers a visual and musical interpretation of a primitive Brazilian legend, shot among the Urubu Indians of Maranhao.

**Ugetsu**

One of the best of the recent Japanese films illustrating the importance of the family in society. The plot concerns a simple potter who is lured from his family by a woman who encourages him to become a samurai. However, he just ain't got it, and finally returns home - without a head.

**August 26 Psyche**

A cinematic stream-of-consciousness poem, suggested by Piere Louy's novel. A sensitive portrayal of a young woman's yearning and fulfillment, vividly photographed in color and accompanied by an unusually beautiful score. Only for adults accompanied by adults.

**Umberto D**

Directed by Vittorio De Sica, this is a touching story of a lonely old retired civil servant with too small a pension and his struggles to exist in a large city. Filmed before the days of T.I.A.A.
