It has been Ensemble-in-Residence at the University of Virginia, and its members have taught at such institutions as the Juilliard School of Music, and the Yale School of Music. The group has given hundreds of concerts in theNew York City schools, as well as performances in the schools of Washington and Philadelphia.
