CASSY. You had an awful lot of help. (They kiss again). I've already told my father.

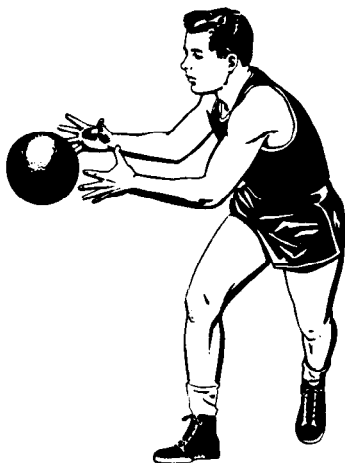
ELLIS. (Astonished) You told your father? What could you tell him?
