BROOKHAVEN SCIENTIST RECEIVES GUGGENHEIM FELLOWSHIP

Dr. Luke C.L. Yuan, nuclear physicist at Brookhaven National Laboratory, has been awarded a Guggenheim Fellowship, it was announced by the John Simon Guggenheim Memorial Foundation. The fellowships are designed to assist the recipients to advance to higher levels of accomplishment in their fields of research and artistic creation, through carrying on the studies for which the Fellowships are awarded. The foundation was established in 1925 by the late senator from Colorado, Simon Guggenheim, and his wife in memory of a son, John Simon Guggenheim, who died in 1922.

Dr. Yuan, who was born in China, is now a U.S. citizen. He studied at Yenching University, Peiping, and received his PhD. from California Institute of Technology in 1940. He joined the Laboratory in 1949, and became a staff member of the Cosmotron Department, where he has specialized in studies of high energy particle interactions. He intends to devote his Guggenheim Award to further these studies at the Centre d'Etudes Nucleaires at Saclay, France and the European Organization for Nuclear Research (CERN) at Geneva, Switzerland as a Visiting Professor, for the year starting July 1958.
