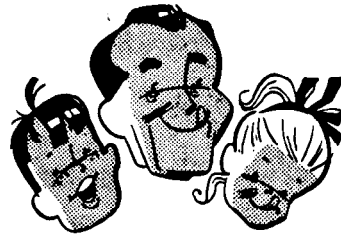

The idea of holding a social affair of a nature that would afford pleasure for grown-ups and fun for children, has been frequently considered since BNL started functioning. The present BERA Social Committee under the Chairmanship of Marianne Kugler, (Physics Dept.) has finally advanced the idea beyond the conversational stage.
