10,000 HOT DOGS AND HAMBURGERS ORDERED

A sufficient number of booths to provide rapid serving of food is planned. Appetites are not to be dulled by long waits, according to the many food committee members. The menu will include hamburgers (made from choice beef, ground fresh on the morning of the picnic, formed into patties and refrigerated until delivery on-site, just in time for the first customers). The highest grade, fresh, all-beef frankfurters will be delivered at the same time. Premium prices are being paid to insure that all the meats are of the highest quality and are also fresh. Rolls and buns will also be fresh (baked Friday night). These will be accompanied by all of the usual trimmings like sliced onions, catsup, sauerkraut, mustard, relishes, etc. Sweet corn in abundance, and baked beans aplenty will round out the "foundation" part of the menu.

Then there will be watermelon without limit, ice cream in dixie cups, lots of cold coca cola and barrels of cold beer. It might be wise to bring your own pitcher so you can serve beer speedily to your own group.

It is planned to confine food serving to the 3 hours between 4 and 7 p.m.

She follows them at first reluctantly, but finally voluntarily, and dies on "the last bridge" from both German and Yugoslav gunfire. The tact and humanity of the story have been signalized in the international prizes awarded to the film.
