Splash Party Brings Children's Summer Program To A Close



A giant "Splash Party" on Thursday served as a climax for the program involving swin class members and gym session participants. Novelty events of a varied nature provided the fun. Every child (and they numbered about 150) left the pool, after three hours of festivities, with a smile and something in the way of prizes, bubble gum, lollypops, hard candy and chocolate bars. Events included: Lighted candle carry (across pool), balloon blowing (underwater), inner tube racing, block gathering (small wooden blocks), fetching pennies, funniest dive, plate race (push paper plate across pool without use of hands), "diving" watermellon contest and others.
