Here's your invitation to attend the Valentine Costume Dance this Friday, February 13, starting at 8:30 p.m. in the Recreation Hall in the Apartment area.

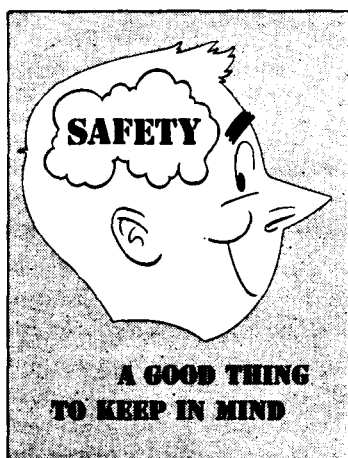
This is a grand opportunity to get back into practice with your fox trots, tangos, cha-cha-chas, waltzes, rumbas, to the music of the best bands on record.
