SWIMMING POOL ADMISSION

Admission to the swimming pool is granted ONLY to:

1. Employees
2. Members of employees' family (members of same household only).
3. Guests of employee or family member. (a) Employees permitted to bring no more than 5 guests; (b) Employees must accompany and be responsible for guests; (c) If several employees bring a group of youngsters, they must accompany and supervise in the pool area.

ADMISSION THROUGH the GATES of the Laboratory to use the swimming pool is controlled by the Security Office. However, members of employees' family ARE PERMITTED through to use the pool if they:

1. Are accompanied by an employee.
2. Are in possession of a SEASON POOL TICKET.
3. Are in possession of a TEMPORARY IDENTIFICATION CARD issued by the Security Office.

Youngsters, particularly teenagers, coming to the pool without the employee will be requested to present evidence of the above.

FINNISH FILM FEATURED

"THE WHITE REINDEER"

The folklore of Finland contains a number of tales of mysticism and witchcraft, many of them centering about a bewitched white reindeer. The reindeer of these tales is supposedly a transformed woman who appears at certain times of the moon and kills, and such is the theme of this film.

Visually THE WHITE REINDEER is quite exceptional: the stark, icy landscape of Lapland adds much to the brooding and terrifying dramatic moments of the film when the girl, about to be transformed into the reindeer, is selecting her next victim. Einar Englund's musical score, too, is effective in helping to convey the strange, unearthly mood.

To call THE WHITE REINDEER a "horror film" might seem to detract from its aesthetic qualities, but whatever its intent, the result is certainly spine chilling suspense. Selected as Best Foreign Film of the Year by the Hollywood Foreign Press Association (1956), and Cannes Festival Award as best film based on legend.
