REGISTRATION DEADLINE - JUNE 30

Starting the week of July 6 swimming classes for all Laboratory employees' children will be conducted afternoons under the direction of two B.E.R.A. instructors (Gene Collins and Beverly Wellings) with the assistance of our two B.E.R.A. lifeguards (Everett Ramsey and George Petropolis). The pool will be open during the scheduled class periods to ONLY the children who are registered for instruction. Please register early! A program will be arranged based on the returned applications. The BULLETIN BOARD will announce the time and schedule of classes.

Important: If there are days your child can NOT attend classes, indicate this on application. No registration fees will be refunded.

SWIMMING CLASSES: 1:00 - 2:30 p.m.

- 1. These classes are for all Laboratory employees' children.
- 2. Children must be eight years of age or four feet in height.
- 3. Each child will be scheduled for a specific period, probably once a week depending on response.
- 4. A fee of \$2.00 per child must accompany application. (make checks payable to B.E.R.A.)
- 5. Children will report at the Swimming Pool not earlier than 12:50 p.m.

6. Classes will end at 2:30 p.m. Off-site children must remain in the pool area until picked up by parents. On-site children must remain in the pool or proceed directly to apartment area.

7. Children will pay daily admission fee (.35) or present season ticket to enter swimming pool.

8. To the best of your knowledge, select and write in on application the group your child qualifies for: **Beginner**, Non-swimmer or NOT able to swim 40 feet. **Intermediate**, Can swim at least 40 feet. **Swimmer**, Can swim 100 yards.

SWIMMING POOL

The pool does not open for general admissions until 2:30 p.m. daily. Parents bringing children to the Laboratory to swim are requested not to do so before 2:15 p.m. **Children will be required to remain in the pool area until picked up by parents.**

GYMNASIUM

The gym will be open for miscellaneous evening activities beginning June 23 and will continue on the following schedule until the end of August: **EVENINGS - MONDAY THRU THURSDAY** - until 9:00 p.m. Equipment is available for badminton, basketball, volleyball, table tennis, exercising, etc., etc. ...

ATHLETIC PLAY SESSION

A summer program for ON-SITE residents children will start on Monday, July 6 at the Recreation Building on York Lane in the apartment area.

The morning session will be well supervised by two instructors and will provide a well balanced, varied program which will include both instruction and play (group and individual games, athletic skills, volleyball, badminton, table tennis, croquet, tether-ball, etc., etc. ...). Registration applications will be sent directly to each apartment resident. Children will be expected to wear gym sneakers and play clothes.

ALL EMPLOYEES!
