COME SEE JULIE AND LAURENCE

BERA's feature film for Monday, July 20 with the heroine labeled as a "nymph in sheet's clothing" is titled "I AM A CAMERA" . . . Julie Harris, the celebrated actress who has walked off with virtually every important Drama Critics' citation, re-creates for this film the role of amoral, impudent Sally Bowles which she made famous on Broadway; Laurence Harvey (ROOM AT THE TOP) plays Christopher Isherwood, the writer whose partly autobiographical stories were turned into the Drama Critics' Circle Award-winning play by John van Druten; and Shelley Winters appears as the heiress Natalie Landauer. The result is a hilarious tale of Bohemian life in the Berlin of 1931 which at the same time manages to convey some of the turmoil and tragedy of the period when the spirit of the city prepared to bow before impending chaos.

COCA-COLA VENDING MACHINES

Coca-Cola vending machines, purchased with B.E.R.A. funds, are located throughout the Laboratory for the use of the employees. Any profits derived from sales are used to offset the expenses of the recreation activities.

Each empty bottle not returned to the racks provided at the machines means a loss of two cents to B.E.R.A., and consequently less funds to use for recreation activities. Since the service was started in 1954, 66,000 BOTTLES HAVE BEEN LOST, OR A LOSS OF \$1320.00 FOR RECREATION PURPOSES!

It will be appreciated if everyone will return empty bottles found to the racks where the machines are located. Obviously the cooperation of all employees in returning bottles will help to minimize losses.

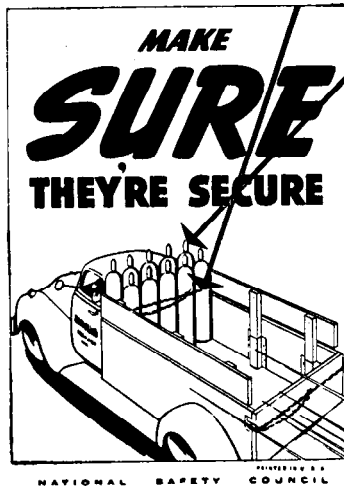
DUPLICATE BRIDGE
