BERA FILM SERIES ODD OBSESSION

Thurs., Dec. 17 — Lecture Hall — 8:30 p.m.

"Odd Obsession," directed by Kon Ichikawa, is a very adult exploration of moral breakdown and is both clinical and comic in its examination of the subject. An aging man, married to a young and attractive wife, is told by his young doctor that he is losing his virility. He induces the doctor, who is his daughter's suitor, to become his wife's lover. This ironic interplay continues throughout the film. The husband's increasingly franctic efforts to restore his failing virility and to keep his wife results in drawing a tighter and tighter web of dangerous complications until they explode in a dramatic, and somewhat unexpected climax. The delicate subject is handled with immaculate taste.

BNL PAY CHECK DISTRIBUTION



An improved system of weekly employee pay check distribution is being inaugurated by the Laboratory in January.

Beginning Thursday, January 7, 1965, BNL weekly employees will no longer have to travel to the on-site Peoples National Bank facility in order to pick up their pay checks. Instead, employees' checks will be distributed through their departments to the vicinity of their work stations or at some convenient central department location. Pay checks for weekly shift employees will continue to be available as in the past, when so requested by the employees' supervisors. The method of monthly pay check distribution will remain unchanged.

It is expected that the new check distribution plan will be helpful to all Laboratory employees since it will eliminate the queueing at the bank on Fridays. There will, of course, be no change in the on-site banking facilities. The privilege of using these services will continue to be available to employees within reasonable limits subject to the needs of their work schedules and the permission of their supervisors.

You may have your check mailed directly for deposit to any bank you designate. Checks will normally be mailed to banks no later than Thursday morning. (Checks slated for the Peoples National Bank will arrive there on Thursdays.)



You May Make Savings Account Deposits by Automatic Deduction

You may arrange to have deductions from your pay check for deposit directly to your savings account in the Peoples National Bank.
