Elisabeth Palmado was graduated in 1960 from the New England Conservatory, where she studied voice with Gladys Miller and coached with Felix Wolfes and John Moriarity. She has appeared in concert at Jordan Hall, the Isabella Gardiner Museum, the German Club of Boston and the Cambridge Morning Musicales. She studied opera with Boris Goldovsky, appeared in his productions at the Conservatory, and sang leads in Harvard University productions and the Arundel Opera theatre. During 1962-3, Mrs. Palmado studied in Paris with Pierre Bernac and gave recitals at the American Center and the American Atelier. She now studies in New York City with Emmy Joseph. Her husband is a physicist at the Laboratory.

Sakae Shirane studied in Japan with Joseph Rosenstock, a Metropolitan Opera conductor. In her native country, she appeared on the concert stage as accompanist to violinists and singers. Mrs. Shirane has been living in the United States for the past ten years. Presently, she is residing in Bellport with her husband, a Brookhaven physicist, and their children.

BASKETBALL**

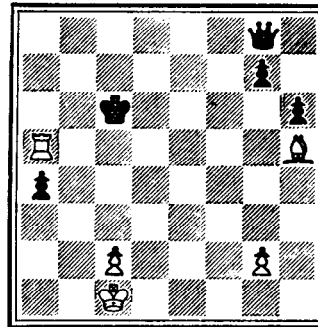

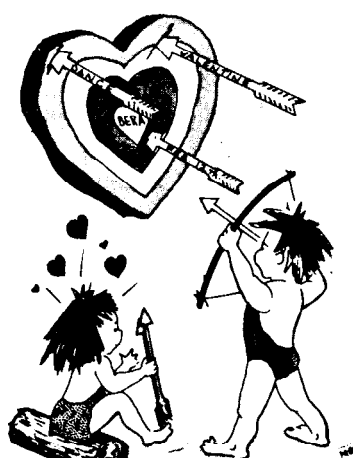
