CHARLES F. DUNBAR, JR. TO PRESENT TALK ON IRAN

A lecture on contemporary Iran will be given by Mr. Charles F. Dunbar, Jr., in the Lecture Hall on Wednesday, July 28, at 3:30 p.m. Mr. Dunbar is a member of the Foreign Service of the U.S. Department of State and is stationed at Isfahan, Iran, as Vice Consul. He will discuss what he describes as Iran's unsteady drive toward modernity and the significance of the Shah's "revolution." This will be an excellent opportunity to share in the interesting opinions and experiences of a young career diplomat in the Middle East.

BERA FILM SERIES ANTIGONE



Plus Special Short Feature Thurs., July 22 — Lecture Hall — 8:30 p.m.

A Greek company has taken a great play and made a lucid and beautiful motion picture out of it. This is Greek drama as one has always hoped to see it performed – the action simple and uncluttered, the characters driven by instinct and passion, the voices so eloquent that we experience the beauty of the language. For the first time, we have a screen version of a classical Greek tragedy that is faithful to the plot and text, preserving the strength and nobility of the conception. Irene Papas is a magnificent figure as Antigone, daughter of Oedipus, the woman who defies the kingly authority of her uncle Creon when it outrages her feelings and her sense of justice and obligation. For his performance in the film, Manos Katrakis received the Best Actor Award at the 1962 San Francisco Film Festival.

The adaption and direction are by George Tzavellas, who shows love and respect for his material. There are no easy spectacular effects but, as Penelope Gilliatt observed at the Berlin Festival presentation, "there are moments, like the shot of Plynices' corpse lying small and dangerous in the sun, that extend the poetry as only film can." The English subtitles by Noelle Gillmore should make most other subtitlers blush; they are a model of taste and literacy, a demonstration that subtitling can be a branch of the fine craft of translation.
