BNL AGAIN VISITED AS POSSIBLE SITE FOR 200-BeV ACCELERATOR

The National Academy of Sciences Site Evaluation Committee met at BNL last Sunday, December 5. This committee was organized last April at the request of the USAEC to study proposals for specific sites on which a planned 200-BeV accelerator could be constructed.

From the original proposals, 85 were selected for further study. AEC factfinding teams are visiting sites all over the U.S. in connection with each of these proposals, and on November 23, a team spent the day at Brookhaven. The recent meeting of the NAS Committee here can be considered as another phase in the study of BNL's suitability for the proposed giant accelerator.

BROOKHAVEN LECTURE PLANT GENETIC TUMORS

How does an individual develop its component parts? How do cells of the same genotype evolve into specialized structures with different functions?

In the coming Brookhaven Lecture on December 15, Dr. Harold Smith of the Biology Department will discuss re-

search done on tobacco plant tumors that is shedding light on the mechanisms of genetic activities in generations of cells. Dr. Smith's studies with tobacco plants which have a genetic tendency to form tumors have revealed the changes in cellular activities which distinguish normal, differentiated cells from cancerous, undifferentiated cells. By studying the genetic factors and conditions that cause tumors, scientists are given clues to the regulatory mechanisms that govern cell differentiation.

Slide presentations and a time-lapse film will highlight Dr. Smith's talk. The lecture will be given on December 15, 8:00 p.m. at the Brookhaven Center.
