'Mafioso'

This much-recommended film concerns a respected factory worker on holiday with his family to his native Sicily. Asked by his employer to deliver a package, he gets into the thick of a Mafia conspiracy. The principal, Alberto Sordi, has been slyly partnered with a little cheesecake in the form of Brazilian actress Norma Bengel and the two are surrounded by some of the finest Sicilian "local color" on film: a huge bowl of sinister-looking black spaghetti turns out to be standard white spaghetti - smothered with squid-ink sauce; a statue of the Virgin (especially admired by the Mafia) has big, soft, sentimental eyes - and holds a skull in her hands; and there is a marvelous scuffle by two toothless, hissing old men.
