

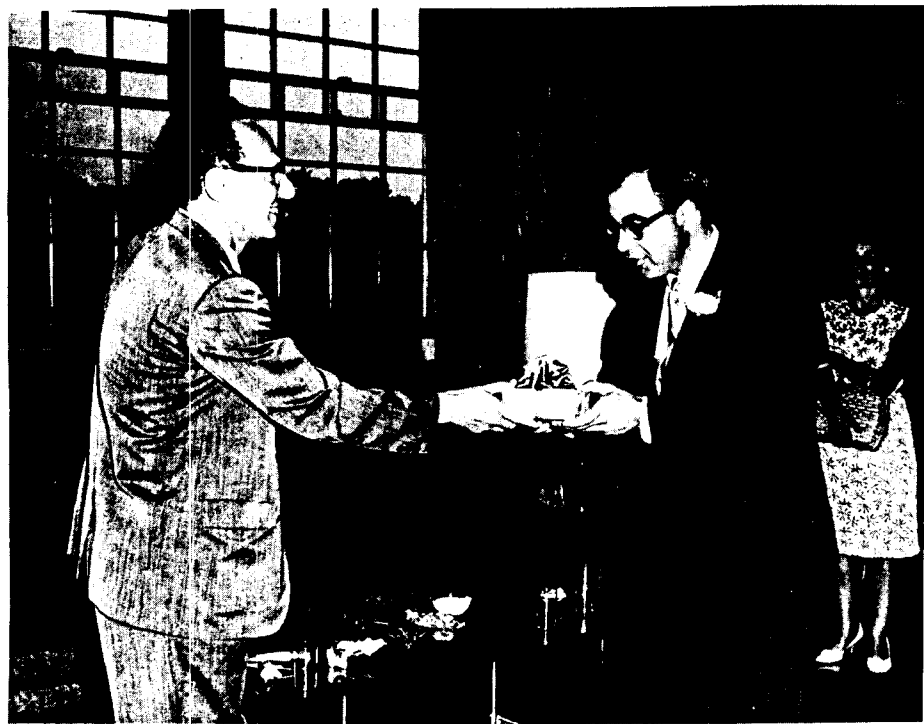

## Berkeley Will Host Int'l High-Energy Physics Conference

The world's luminaries in high-energy physics will gather at the University of California, Berkeley, from August 31 through September 7 for the 13th International Conference on High-Energy Physics.

Lawrence Radiation Laboratory, where the late E.O. Lawrence invented the cyclotron, is the host institution.

The meeting is sponsored jointly by the AEC and the International Union of Pure and Applied Physics in Paris.

Most of the 450 experimental and theoretical physicists will come from the United States, Western Europe, and the Soviet Union, with additional representation from Eastern European countries, Latin America, Canada, South Africa, Israel, Australia, India, Japan, and Pakistan. Twenty-eight countries will be represented. Attendance is by invitation only.

The agenda is arranged so that papers are presented in the morning, leaving the afternoons open for organized discussion groups. Dr. Rodney L. Cool, Associate Director of High-Energy Physics at BNL, will be a chairman of a session devoted to Symmetries of Strong Interactions and Electromagnetic Mass Splittings and Magnetic Moments of Hadrons; and Dr. Nicholas Samios of the Physics Department here will lead the discussions on Meson Resonances.

Conference Chairman is Dr. Edwin M. McMillan, Nobel Laureate and Director of the Lawrence Radiation Laboratory. The program has been arranged under the chairmanship of Dr. LeRoy T. Kerth, professor of physics at Berkeley and physicist at the Lawrence Radiation Laboratory.

The Atomic Energy Commission is considering the issuance of a permit to Oregon State University for construction of a Triga Mark II research reactor on the campus at Corvallis.
