Oak Ridge Reactor

National Landmark

In a ceremony scheduled for September 13, at Oak Ridge National Laboratory, the X-10 Reactor will be dedicated as a National Landmark by the Department of the Interior.

The Graphite Reactor, as it is called, was shut down in 1963, its work load taken over by more sophisticated devices. At that time, Oak Ridge reported that it was the oldest operating reactor in the United States.

Construction was begun on the X-10, the world's second reactor, in February, 1943, two months after the late Enrico Fermi operated the first reactor at the University of Chicago.

Built in secrecy as a crash effort of the Manhattan Project, the X-10 Reactor had a singular purpose, the production of enough fissionable plutonium for studies aimed at developing a chemical process for the separation of large quantities of man-made plutonium from neutron-bombarded uranium.

Dr. Glenn T. Seaborg, Chairman of the AEC, will participate in the brief program which will include the presentation of a certificate and unveiling of a bronze plaque.
