The Eighth Day of the Week

Based on the novel by Poland's "angry young author," Marek Hlasko, this film was produced in two identical versions, Polish and German. Because of the Polish Government's refusal to release its negative, the film is being presented in the United States in the German version. What emerges is a tender and touching story, adult and realistic, of two people trying to find fulfillment of their love in a crowded, dispirited city slowly rebuilding on the rubble of war. Bedeviled by a series of obstacles, they succeed in rising above the surroundings which threaten to destroy their love. The film is a strong, even raw, expression of sex on one hand, and a poignant, touching, and even funny story on the other.

Short: Dom

Awarded the Grand Prix at Brussels in 1958, this color short is an example of the new school of experimental Polish films which has so impressed Western critics. A woman fights for her husband (or lover) who may be fighting a duel. He arrives, caresses him, and he disintegrates. The work continues in this surrealist tradition.
