## Fish Tales

Wire line fishing to the novice can be a nightmare. Ask Steve Gracia, Hugh McNeill and Bob Petersen. They've long since passed their course in wire line "knitting," but I recall several instances which make their individual styles uniquely coincidental. They are, I believe, the only three who can hook a fish with a hopelessly tangled line trailing lifelessly twenty feet from the boat. The most important thing to remember when letting the wire out is to go slowly for the first fifty feet with your thumb hard on the spool. Use a 25 ft. mono Leader and fish approximately 100 ft. of wire to every 10 ft. of water.

According to Kurt Jellet and Dick Albert, schools of blues have been moving east for two weeks. Dick was out of Shinnecock Inlet drifting in his dory about 3 miles off, and spotted school after school pushing a "V" type wake in front of them. This doesn't happen too often, but when it does, it seems exceedingly difficult to induce them to strike. This method worked well enough for one 7 lb. fish, but still failed to produce the action one would expect from such a large body of fish.

Try drifting in the swift tide at Jessups with squid on the bottom. Blues from 1½ to 6 lbs. were taken there last week.

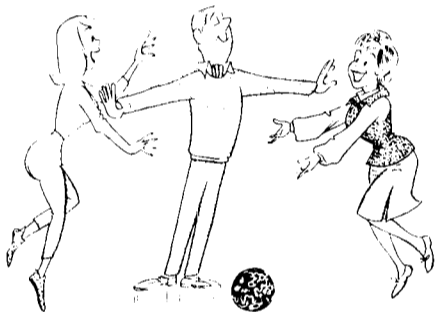

**PUSHAWAY:** A maneuver employed by the smooth bowler. A pleasant chore necessitated by the proximity of adoring fans.

**PUSHAWAY:** A smooth pushaway insures a smooth delivery. From a proper stance, the ball moves out and the right foot moves forward at approximately the same time. The length of the first step is determined by the length of the pushaway. If a bowler is taking a rather large, even awkward, first step, he corrects this by cutting back on the energy he puts into his pushaway - smoothing out his entire delivery. The pushaway starts the bowler into motion. Therefore, it is extremely important.
