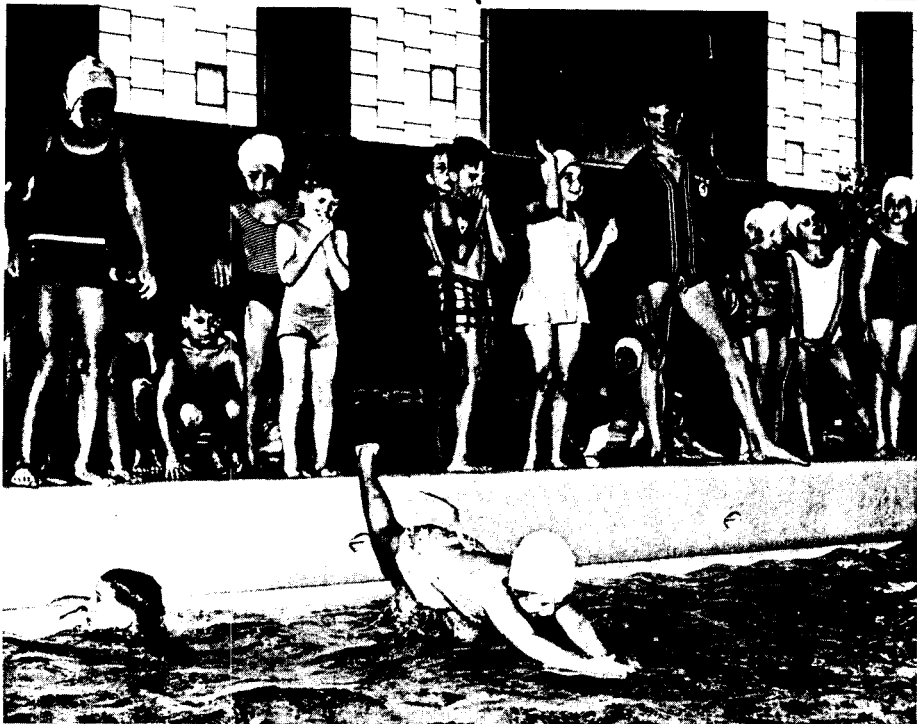

Summer Program Set

Once again this year, the Recreation Office will offer a "Summer Program" for the children of Laboratory employees. Supervision will be provided by two experienced instructors.

Registration of each child must be made in advance, and parents will be requested to sign a responsibility form agreeing to the program's necessary regulations.

The on-site play sessions will begin July 8th and the swimming lessons will begin the week of July 15th and continue through late August. A special activities day, which will be held in August, has been planned in the swimming pool. The exact date will be announced.

On-Site Play Sessions

The morning portion of the program will be for the children of on-site residents only. Participants must be at least five years of age. Teenagers are encouraged to participate. The sessions will be held daily from 9:00 a.m. to 11:30 a.m. at the Recreation Building in the Apartment Area. Applications will be sent directly to residents. Several special programs will be scheduled to afford parents an opportunity to see or join their children in action.

Non-Swimmer - Unable to swim at all.

1. These classes are for all Laboratory employees' children.

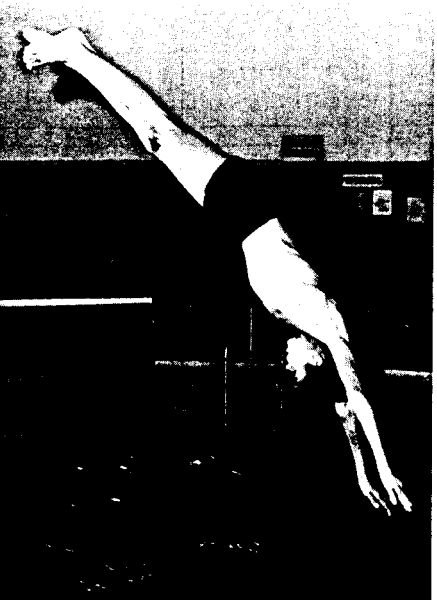
2. Children must be four feet in height.

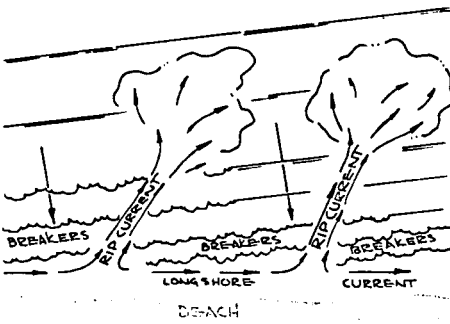

Surfers and Swimmers Cautioned on Riptides

Each year, in spite of warnings, drownings occur because people do not understand the workings of ocean currents along the South Shore of Long Island.

The rip current, erroneously called a riptide, is a relatively narrow, high speed flow which returns to sea the water brought shoreward by waves; thus the cycle of water transport shoreward by waves, along the shore by longshore currents, and offshore by rip currents, completes the near-shore circulation system.

Rips are the cause of many needless drownings, usually because the swimmer becomes exhausted while attempting to swim to shore directly against the current. Since a rip is a narrow current, the swimmer should always swim parallel to the beach until out of the current, then on into shore. Good luck!

Ralph Weston Lecture In Physics Seminar Room

The 76th Brookhaven Lecture will be delivered on Wednesday, July 10, at 8 p.m. in the Physics Department Seminar Room. The speaker will be Dr. Ralph E. Weston of the Chemistry Department, who will discuss "Interatomic Forces in Chemical Reactions."

Dr. Weston, a senior Chemist, has been at Brookhaven since 1951, except for a one-year leave spent at the Nuclear Research Center at Saclay, France. He received his B.S. degree from the University of California (Berkeley) in 1946, and a Ph.D. from Stanford University in 1950. Before coming to BNL, Dr. Weston spent two years in the Chemistry Department of Harvard University as a Research Fellow. His research interests include the use of isotopes in the study of chemical equilibria and kinetics, and the Brookhaven Lecture will emphasize the latter field.

Dr. Weston will describe the way in which the rate of a chemical reaction is determined by the forces between the atoms taking part in the reaction. Several theoretical and experimental methods which can be used to determine these interatomic forces will be discussed briefly. The main emphasis will be kinetic isotope effects - the effect of isotopic substitution on rates of reaction - which has been developed into a technique for exploring the detailed mechanism of the reaction process.
