In a free-form, improvisational structure, Godard has taken the music of Michel Legrand, added Karina, Belmondo, and Brialy, and wrapped all this up with the brilliant color photography of Raoul Coutard, to give the audience a rare insight into the director's views on women, Hollywood, off-beat musicals, and love.

Eight Brookhaven employees participated in the Annual Careers Day at Longwood High School sponsored by the Middle Island Rotary Club on December 6.


The event allows students the opportunity to talk with individuals actively engaged in specific careers. It supplies them with information to more effectively plan their future in both education and industry.
