Group Insurance

The Internal Revenue Act of 1964 provides that employees' group term life insurance, in excess of \$50,000 results in income reportable to the IRS.

Beginning with the first pay period in January, that information will be included on pay statements of employees having such income in a box which will read "Ins. Earn." In the past, that type of income was determined only at the end of each calendar year and was included on an employee's W-2 Form as "Cost of Group Term Life Insurance."

Taxability of group term life insurance in excess of \$50,000 is based on premiums (according to age) prescribed by the IRS, less amounts contributed by the employee during the year towards the purchase of the coverage.
