BNL Studies Osteoporosis

There are many ways to combat disease: attack it head on with medication; determine its cause and do something about that; or attempt to alleviate its symptoms with therapy. BNL's research into osteoporosis covers all three fronts.

Osteoporosis can occur when a body's skeleton loses its natural calcium, thus diminishing the bones' structural strength. Osteoporosis is often difficult to diagnose before clinical symptoms appear. Sometimes the patient may initially experience spontaneous fractures requiring complicated treatments and lengthy healing periods. Though osteoporosis is generally associated with the aging process and appears most often in postmenopausal women, it is sometimes due to hormonal deficiency and can afflict both sexes.

In 1968, the Medical Department's Medical Physics Group, headed by Dr. Stanton Cohn, initiated an osteoporosis program. The oldest aspect of this program aims to help persons with osteoporosis by treating them with various combinations of drugs and hormones. These studies are conducted by Dr. Ashok Vaswani, in collaboration with Dr. John F. Aloia of the Department of Medicine at Nassau Hospital.

Before treatment starts, a patient's total body calcium is determined by exposure to moderated neutrons through a technique called whole body neutron activation analysis. Quickly, before the radioactivity disappears, the patient is transferred to an instrument called a whole body counter, which measures the radioactivity to determine the calcium content and distribution throughout the skeleton. After this, the patient begins a drug regimen intended to stop, reduce or reverse calcium loss. Most of the medications used in the program are experimental and only approved for research. Patients can receive treatment at BNL for only two years, after which they return to their own physicians for treatment and followup.

While many drugs have been successful in relieving symptoms, Vaswani, who has headed BNL's treatment program since 1979, said they do not offer a cure for the disease. "The purpose of the treatment is to at least slow down the rate of calcium loss

from the bones and, if possible, to achieve a positive calcium balance. Once treatment is finished, the patient may continue to lose calcium, but hopefully at a slower rate."

Perhaps a better understanding of the nature of the disease will lead some day to even more effective treatment. That's the basis for the second approach Vaswani is taking — an epidemiological or population study involving people from age 20 to over 70 who do not have symptoms suggestive of osteoporosis. Using the whole body counter, this group is monitored to see how aging affects bone calcium and how the effects differ from person to person. Eventually, this study may answer such questions as: What kind of bone changes occur over a period of time and why? Is there something specific in the patient's history? Why do only 25% of all women develop osteoporosis when all women age and have less estrogen after menopause?.

One thing already known is that when physical activity is increased over a period of time, the bone benefits. This knowledge has led to a third approach in combating the ailment — intervention through exercise. Physical therapist Sid Jungreis, who conducts the exercise program, explained, "When there is positive stress on the long bones of the body, there is a tendency to arrest calcium loss and produce calcium retention." To monitor these effects, whole body counting techniques are also used in this program.

Because the bones of patients with osteoporosis are so brittle, Jungreis approaches exercise development cautiously. "I start with a very low base level, well within their capacity," he said. "If they develop muscle spasms or cramps, they'll be discouraged. We can always build up if we go slow; if we start too high, we can set people back." At the peak of the program, patients work out for about one-half hour with five pieces of equipment: a treadmill, a stationary bicycle, a rowing machine, mats, and small dumbbells.

The people in Jungreis' exercise groups range in age from 55 to 86. Groups of volunteers from BNL have been exercising on equipment in the Medical Department four afternoons (Continued on page 2)

How Did We Do?

When the Laboratory's first total evacuation drill officially ended at 4:35 p.m. on Monday, November 23, BNL was "virtually deserted," said Bob Young, Laboratory Emergency Supervisor. Noting that it took less than 25 minutes for approximately 3000 people to leave the site, Young added, "All employees gave an amazing degree of cooperation."

At the critique on Tuesday morning, Young emphasized that the drill had accomplished its primary goals: to familiarize employees with emergency procedures, and to prove that total evacuation could be completed quickly and in an orderly fashion.

The drill was also valuable in indicating areas that need correction. One such area is anticipation. For this drill, employees expected to hear first a warbling air horn — the signal to go to the nearest assembly point. Ten minutes later, they anticipated and heard the signal to evacuate. In the future, employees are cautioned not to prejudge the second siren. Although this drill emphasized total evacuation, the next drill, or a real incident, would most likely require selective evacuation, where groups closest to the source of danger would be the first to leave. These groups would be notified by telephone or radio, and the evacuation sirens might never be used.

Another problem was that in some areas either the warbling air horns, the sirens or both could not be heard. While this situation is being corrected, it was also pointed out that backup systems — including phone calls and radio transmissions — worked.

Finally, because the drill was planned, some employees chose not to car-pool that day to avoid any problems picking up passengers at the off-site assembly point at Parr Meadows. As a result, said Len Emma, Assistant to the Director, "We probably had a maximum number of cars on site." Despite that, and the fact that only three BNL police officers helped direct traffic, the bottlenecks that threatened to create gridlock at some intersections were overcome. Emma, who observed this from overhead in a Suffolk County Police Department helicopter, said "It seemed that traffic flowed out of all three gates relatively smoothly." That is also how it appeared to Laboratory Director George Vineyard, Associate Director Victor Bond, and DOE's Brookhaven Area

Office Manager David Schweller, who witnessed the evacuation from Police Headquarters on Upton Road.

Young thanked the Suffolk County Police Department for the loan of the helicopter and their help in directing traffic at the Lab's main entrance on William Floyd Parkway. He also thanked "all departments on site for developing their notification plans in a minimum period of time, and the employees of those departments who helped make the drill so successful."

Radio Your Hello

If you would like to send a holiday greeting to friends or relatives in the U.S. and elsewhere, the amateur radio service will be glad to do it for you. This saves time and gives your message a distinctive touch.

Dave Potter and George Walczyk, BNL ham radio operators, are your first contacts. Call Potter at 472-2394, or Walczyk at 698-3918. They will arrange to start your message on its way through the amateur radio network. When it arrives at or near its destination, your message will be phoned to the recipient, or if phone service is not available, will be sent by local mail.

Amateur radio operators are an important facet of emergency communications and they are required to build up the skills needed in handling message traffic. They are licensed to transmit personal messages and holiday greetings, but cannot relay business transactions. They can send a personal message for you not only during the holiday season, but at any time of the year. The service is free.

Ham operators are permitted to transmit messages in the U.S. and 28 other countries throughout the world. In North America these countries are Canada, Costa Rica, Cuba, Dominican Republic, El Salvador, Guatemala, Haiti, Honduras, Jamaica, Mexico, Nicaragua, Panama. In South America you can reach friends in Argentina, Bolivia, Brazil, Chile, Colombia, Ecuador, Guyana, Paraguay, Peru, Trinidad and Tobago, Uruguay, Venezuela. Other countries included in the amateur network are Israel, Jordan, Ghana, Liberia and Switzerland (Geneva).

When Saving Cents Makes Sense

Did you know? — That the average cost on the many convenience copiers located throughout the Laboratory is 3.8¢ per copy and that the average cost per copy at the Quick Copy Service Center is 1.2¢, or a difference of 2.6¢. Big deal — only 2.6¢ you think!

Did you know? — There are over 6,500,000 copies a year produced on convenience copiers at BNL. If those same copies had been produced at the Copy Center, potentially \$169,000 could have been saved. Obviously, no small piece of change.

To be realistic — It is not practical or economical for all copies to be reproduced at the Copy Center. Some jobs by their very nature will not benefit from the automated equipment at the Center which makes this lower cost possible. These jobs include

bound material, oversized originals which cannot be reduced, ragged originals, and, other customized work. This type of work can be reproduced at the same cost on your convenience copier. However, most unbound originals in reasonable shape in which multiple copies are needed are ideal for economical, automated back to back reproduction at the Copy Center.

Consider this — For every 1,000,000 copies that can be transferred to the Copy Center, over \$26,000 can be saved. If you must use your convenience copier, do not treat it casually. Only copy what is needed. Remember that at 3.8¢ per copy each press of the button can mean big bucks when taken collectively.

Changes In HMO Plan

As previously announced, the Community Health Plan of Suffolk has been taken over by the Blue Cross/Blue Shield of Greater New York HMO, and will operate the facility as a state-qualified HMO plan.

Effective January 1, 1982, all existing CHPS contracts will be converted to the Blue Cross/Blue Shield HMO level of benefits and rates. While benefits under Blue Cross/Blue Shield HMO are comprehensive and cover a wide range of medical and hospital service, they will differ from that previously provided by CHPS, as indicated in the following comparison.

An ILR covering the cost of mailing must be presented to the Laboratory Mail Room in order to have the necessary postage affixed to official mail.

each week since June. Four mornings weekly, Jungreis goes to Leisure Village to work with groups in an exercise room set up there. These people are now completing their two years of therapy. While the full data on their progress are not yet available, Vaswani said, "They are all feeling better. Their joint aches and pains are less. The final proof of improvement will hopefully be an increase in their total body calcium."

Jungreis is looking for volunteers from Leisure Village, and other sources as well, to form new exercise groups. For the treatment program, volunteers are also needed — but only people who already have osteoporosis. The Laboratory will pay the full premium cost for employees and their dependents enrolled in the Blue Cross/Blue Shield HMO plan until the end of March, 1982.
