

Two electrons — that's the difference between a proton and an H^- ion. Considering how minute each of these is, two electrons may seem like a very small difference. But in terms of the performance of BNL's Alternating Gradient Synchrotron (AGS), the difference is a rather large one.

The evidence for this came last week when the AGS initiated its fall physics program using H^- ions to create the proton beam in the accelerator. As an indication of promising benefits to come, the AGS accelerated near record intensities only two days after starting up from a long and difficult shutdown, a feat achieved in the past only after many months of laborious machine tuning.

The new method for producing the proton beam is called H^- charge exchange injection. Don Barton, physicist in charge of operations for the AGS Division, who headed the project, said it started about 3½ years ago and he called it, "the most significant modification to the AGS accelerator proper since the 1971 conversion."

Barton explained how, in H^- charge exchange injection, protons are created from a stream of H^- ions injected into the AGS by the Linac, a 200 MeV linear accelerator. H^- ions have two

electrons orbiting around a proton nucleus. Injection occurs when the H^- ions pass through a very thin carbon foil inside the AGS, which strips the two electrons from about 99% of the H^- ions, leaving only positively-charged protons to circulate around the accelerator. The new method makes it possible to inject very long Linac beam pulses into the AGS very efficiently, and one of the hoped-for consequences is an increase in the AGS intensity.

"An increase in intensity is certainly one of the most attractive reasons for going with H^- injection," said Barton, "but it was not the most predictable result. Such an increase would be a bonus — an addition to other benefits we knew we would get from H^- ."

Two of those benefits — increased safety and serviceability — are a direct result of the very high efficiency of the H^- injection system. In the old injection method, losses at the injection magnets brought efficiency down to the point where only about 25% of the Linac beam was utilized. The lost

beam created high residual radiation levels at the juncture of the Linac with the AGS — from 10-20 rem/hour after a run. Preliminary tests of the H^- system showed that levels after a run, in the same place, ranged from 50 to 200 millirem/hour. Said Barton, "This is a very large difference. Now it's comparable to the low levels of activation we normally see elsewhere in the AGS during a run."

Another compelling reason for the change was that it lessens the burden on the expensive rf power amplifier tubes in the Linac, improving the system's reliability. Since longer pulses can now be injected into the AGS, only 10 to 20 milliamperes of H^- current must be accelerated by the Linac. In contrast, the old injection method required 70 milliamperes of protons. "From the standpoint of operating costs and maintenance, the strain on the Linac equipment is much reduced," Barton said.

In addition to these immediate advantages, H^- injection has implications for two upcoming projects. With the possibility of injecting longer

pulses, it became feasible to consider circulating polarized protons in the AGS. This proposal will become a reality in 1984.

The second project is the Colliding Beam Accelerator (CBA), scheduled to begin operation later in the decade. The increased flexibility available from H^- injection promises the creation of a proton beam of higher quality suitable for injection into the CBA.

An injection system of this type had first been proposed for the AGS by BNL physicists Al Maschke, Krsto Prelec and Theo Sluyters in 1972. Similar systems have since been used for some time in routine operations at Argonne's Zero Gradient Synchrotron and the Fermilab Booster.

To obtain H^- ions, Fermilab had used a source based on one that Sluyters had designed for the use of his Neutral Beam Development Group at BNL. With some further modification, this source became the model for the one now in use at the AGS.

Physicist Dick Witkover collaborated in the development of the new ion source and was responsible for its microprocessor-based control system. The source was installed in the second preinjector pit in the front of the Linac building, using as its base the Phillips Cockcroft-Walton generator from the Lab's original 50 MeV Linac. The source was commissioned last summer, and during this past year, H^- ions were accelerated through the Linac. While the AGS was shut down this summer, the old injection equipment was torn out and replaced with a beam line to accommodate the new method of injection. Operations engineer Ken Reece assisted Barton and Witkover in supervising the source commissioning and also collaborated on beam line design.

The H^- injection system was commissioned in October in conjunction with the AGS' new backup power supply system (see accompanying story). "Things couldn't have gone more smoothly," said Barton, "thanks to all the people who have worked so hard on this project." And, of course, there is the hope of a more intense beam.

"Increased intensity will make certain classes of experiments much easier to do," said Barton. "The Fast Extracted Beam neutrino program can use as much beam as we can produce, and the Slow Extracted Beam program has been evolving in the direction of searches for rare processes. These typically require higher intensity beams.

"But intensity is only one thing," Barton concluded. "This is a very simple, very clean method which essentially creates a source of protons inside the machine. This allows us to turn on the AGS with a significantly enhanced performance. What has changed is the cleanliness of the beam coming into the AGS and the flexibility in tuning once it's inside the accelerator."

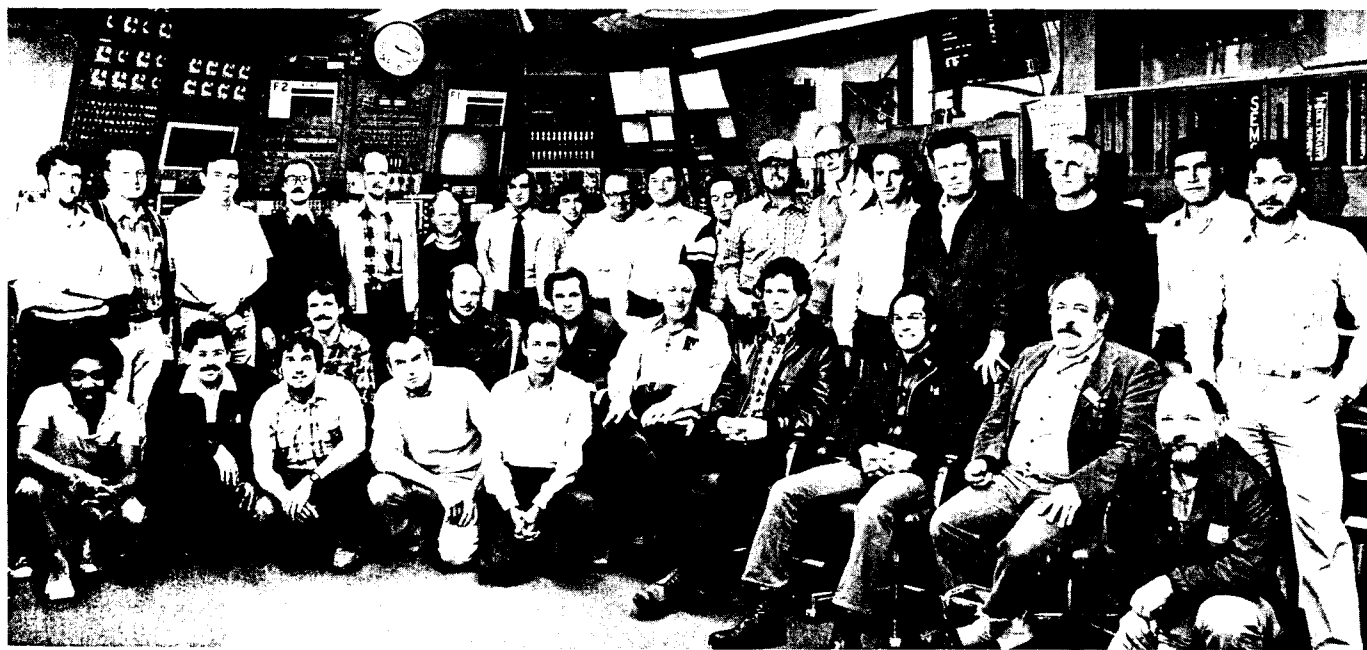


Bob Tallon checks out the Siemens motor generator and power supply.

The Power Behind The Beam

"Heart of the AGS," is the phrase used by electrical power engineer Don Davis to describe the main magnet power supply used to run the accelerator. While those involved in H^- injection worked to complete that project in time for the scheduled start of the fall physics program, the Main Magnet Power Supply Group faced the same deadline in an attempt to keep the "heart of the AGS" pulsing steadily.

Since 1970, a hefty Siemens motor generator and power supply with a

7,200 volt, 3-phase rating, has met the awesome power requirements of the AGS. This demanding task began to take its toll in 1974, when the unit's generator field windings first showed some signs of wear. Temporary repairs seemed to take care of any problems, but concern was growing.

"We had no backup power supply and we worried about the possibility that, if we lost the main magnet power supply, the AGS could be down for a long time," Davis explained. "A replacement rotor, for example, would

take 16 months to manufacture, but at a cost of almost one million dollars, we couldn't afford to have one in reserve. Obviously, we had to take some other route."

In fact, two other routes were chosen. First, at the beginning of the shutdown, the Siemens' two huge components were shipped to General Electric's apparatus service shop in New Jersey for reconditioning. Removing the motor was relatively easy. It was a mere 17 feet long and weighed

only 17.8 tons. With its 3.9-foot diameter, it fit nicely through two double doors.

The generator rotor was another story. To get the 21-foot long, 88.2-ton part out of the AGS building, required removing enough of the wall to accommodate the rotor's 7¼-foot diameter.

The second route taken was to build a backup power supply. Resurrected for this purpose was the 12-phase, low voltage Westinghouse motor-generator originally used to power the AGS. When the 1971 AGS upgrade demanded a unit with longer flat-top pulses and a faster repetition rate, the Westinghouse was retired in favor of the Siemens. Now Davis and consultants Roger Adams and Arnold Feltman took another look at the old workhorse.

For these new responsibilities, the Main Magnet Power Supply Group, under the supervision of Mike Clancy, rewound the Westinghouse to match the Siemens' generating voltage output. The new backup system, located in Bldg. 911, was then connected by cable to the transformer and rectifier in Bldg. 928. Davis said, "The hard

part was matching controls for pulse current and timing. It was truly a team effort." Included on this team were Jim Curto, John Dioguardo, Ed Grahn, John Maddock, John Reany, Bill Schirmer, Charlie Staal and Bob Tallon.

Their efforts were rewarded last month when the Westinghouse backup power supply ran and pulsed the main magnets — just in time to allow the testing of the H⁻ charge exchange injection system for acceleration and extraction.

A short time later, on November 4, the Siemens was returned and successfully tested with a load. "When we shut down, the Siemens' generator had had 102,627,192 pulses in about 12 years," said Davis. "With this reconditioning, we've put another 20 years of life into it, which we really need since the AGS is going to be the injector for the CBA."

In Davis' view, this was "a difficult shutdown. Between both power supplies, this group had a tremendous workload this summer. They did a fantastic job." Clancy agreed, and added, "We received a lot of help from everyone in the AGS. Many people worked hard and went out of their way to help us."

Council Calls For Comments

Last year a committee of the AAAS conducted an informal survey of all the DOE national laboratories on the issues of scientific freedom and responsibility. Following their final report issued in June 1982, Laboratory Director Nicholas Samios requested that the BNL Council determine whether BNL's internal structure and staff policy provide adequate protection to all staff members to express opinions in the event of policy or technical disagreements.

Drill Meets Goals

Here are some notes from the evacuation drill last week Wednesday.

It took 46 minutes to evacuate the site in a selective manner. Warbling air horns sounded at about 4:07 p.m., signaling employees to gather at pre-designated areas. Then at 4:24, the first phone calls were made to evacuate the HFBR, Buildings 701, 703, 750, 801, and 901, and the warehouse area. The selection of "first to go" was based on meteorological conditions at the time.

As people cleared out of those initial areas, more phone calls were made to other zones. Lab observers in a helicopter above kept track of the traffic flow. Finally, at 4:53 p.m., the site sirens were sounded to tell everyone remaining to evacuate, phone call or no.

Robert Young, Laboratory Emergency Supervisor, noted that the drill proceeded a lot more slowly than last year. When it became clear that the sequential evacuation would not be completed before 5 p.m., he decided to use the site siren to signal immediate evacuation of those people remaining.

Among the last to leave were employees in Biology, Medical, the National Center for Analysis of Energy Systems, Personnel, Machine Shops, the Administration building, and ASDP. In general, those in the southwest quadrant of the Lab never received a phone call telling them to evacuate. The site siren was their signal.

For many employees, the 50-minute wait between the sounding of the warbling air horns and the blowing of the site sirens was interminably long. And to some, the evacuation appeared not to go well.

But to the official observers who were evaluating the whole picture, the exercise was a success, and all the major objectives were accomplished. Young reported that there was only one minor grid lock and traffic flowed steadily. The 46 minutes from the time the first people started leaving, to 5:11 p.m. when the last stragglers finally got out, compares to 25 minutes for last year's drill, when everyone left at once, resulting in traffic jams. "What we proved this time," said Young, "is that if we have to, we can do an orderly evacuation from the most critical areas first."
