

Art Auction Will Benefit Your Collection and a Scholarship Fund

Jane Wooster Scott is well-known as America's foremost primitive artist, and her colorful, energetic paintings of Americana are collected by such celebrities as Marlon Brando, Carol Burnett, Valerie Harper, Paul Newman and Sylvester Stallone.

Along with such acclaimed artists as Graciella Rodo-Boulanger, Michel Delacroix and Itzhak Tarkay, Scott is one of dozens whose work will be sold at an auction in Berkner Hall on Saturday, March 19, to be run by Marlin Art Inc., of Deer Park.

Sponsored by Brookhaven Women in Science (BWIS) to benefit the Renate W. Chasman Scholarship Fund, the auction will feature originals and prints in a wide variety of media, ranging from oils and watercolors to graphics and enamels, and may or may not include the works shown here.

The artworks will be available for inspection at 7:30 p.m., and the auction will begin at 8 p.m. The \$5 admission fee includes wine and cheese during the preview and the opportunity to win a door prize.

The average price for the artworks is expected to range between \$50 and \$200. Checks are preferred, but credit cards will also be accepted.

See Camp Upton Via Southampton

Friends of the BNL Science Museum, which is run by Public Affairs' Tour Program, can now appreciate some familiar objects in a new setting, when some of the exhibits from the Lab's Camp Upton Collection are lent by special request to the Parrish Art Museum at Southampton for a new exhibition.

Called "Modern Meets the Masses: 1910-1920," the exhibition is the result of a collaboration between Parrish Museum staff and local high school students to examine social, political and artistic issues and developments of the period.

Long before becoming a national laboratory in 1947, the BNL site was the U.S. Army's Camp Upton. During World War I, thousands trained here before going overseas. A typical soldier was Second Lieutenant John Weeks III of the Signal Corp, whose uniform and photograph were donated to the BNL Science Museum by his son, Senior Metallurgist John Weeks of the Department of Advanced Technology (see photo).

Joining these items at the Parrish Museum will be old barracks photos, including some from Private Irving

Berlin's Broadway hit *Yip Yip Yaphank*, a bayonet and scabbard, and even manuals of field artillery and provisional drill and service regulations, which were discovered in a friend's attic and added to the then just-beginning Camp Upton Collection by Alan Schmidtchen, Photography & Graphic Arts Division.

See the exhibit through April 10, from 11 a.m. to 5 p.m. Mondays and Thursdays through Saturdays, and 1 to 5 p.m. Sundays.
